PARISH STUDY: PAINTING

The Schola Cantorum will sing the famous *Requiem in D minor*, K. 626 by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756-1791). The Mass is co-sponsored by the Catholic Artists Society, the New York Purgatorial Society, and the Society of St. Hugh of Cluny.

DOMINICAN RITE MASS FOR THE FEAST OF ST. ALBERT THE GREAT

On Wednesday, November 15 at 7 PM, a Missa Cantata for the Feast of St. Albert the Great will be offered in the Dominican Rite at St. Vincent Ferrer. St. Albert is the patron saint of Scientists and is an outstanding example of the synthesis of faith and reason. The Schola Cantorum will sing John Taverner's *Missa Sancti Wilhelmi devotio* as well as motets by Palestrina and Willaert.

THE FRUITS OF ENDURANCE

You are reading this letter on the weekend of the New York Marathon, when those who run endure to their limits, and the rest of us stand back in amazement at endurance embodied. The runner gains more than the finish line, for the ability to run stems from a long regimen of training. So we honor the runner's completion of the course and the discipline that allowed him or her to begin it.

Yesterday (Last Sunday for you) I undertook my own, relatively pale endurance and preached all of our Masses. I got to introduce and hear each of the presentations offered by our Finance Council on how we stand as of the conclusion of our first fiscal year as a united parish. As the 6 PM Mass ended on Sunday evening I found myself elated by the dedication of the Councilors and the attentiveness of each congregation. The whole day spoke to me of the maturity our parish has achieved by sticking with a long regimen of change, some of it in directions they would not choose.

I witnessed this process up-close as the Finance Councilors came together in April and, ably supported by Lee Ann Rubino, worked through the summer to study our financial situation and the history that led to it. They prepared the reports you heard, reviewed the budget for this new fiscal year, selected a money manager for our portfolio, and worked with that company to balance and structure it.

I would like to supplement last weekend's presentation by mentioning one aspect of that structure. Since the 1980's the Parish of St. Vincent Ferrer maintained a restricted fund to support maintenance of, and improvements to, the fabric of the church. Pastors drew upon it to replace the roof and to paint and clean the exterior walls. We used it most recently to replace the sidewalk outside the church. This fund remains intact in the newly structured portfolio. We have created a similar fund for the fabric of St. Catherine's Church. Into it we have placed the portfolio of the Parish of St. Catherine of Siena. Monies donated to this fund will be used for maintenance of, and improvements to, the fabric of St. Catherine's Church. We hope that this honors all the effort undertaken by the Friars and people of St. Catherine's to raise these funds in the first place.

What became palpable to me as the Councilors spoke was that a crucial aspect of our communal life was in place. With this comes relief, gratitude, and the freedom to set other things in place

Alongside the Finance Council stands a number of strong parish organizations and each of these has worked through our years of change with patience and suppleness. We need now to access the experience and insights of these core parishioners. I think we can do this by the way we structure the Pastoral Council. This consultative body serves the Pastor as his "eyes and ears," as a sounding board, and as a disseminator of information. Through the years of our merger we were served admirably by an interim Pastoral Council which completed its work in June. I have been meeting with parishioners and assembling a new Council. I anticipate that it will be complete and begin its work in January. In addition to providing the helps I mention above, it will serve to structure our range of committees and guilds, so that the social and charitable life of the parish rests on its own firm foundation.

When the Pastoral Council begins to meet the structure of our parish governance will be in place and we can turn our gaze outward with confidence.

I have long felt that the order that emerges has more beauty and endurance than the order which is imposed, and so I have tried to accept the discipline of slow-growing each aspect of our life so that it emerges from a real basis in the life of the parish, and meet a real need in that same life. So I thank you for your patience with the lack of certainty this may entail from time to time.

CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD NOTES

For your consideration, below are the next four points of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd 32 Points of Reflection.

17. A material is placed at the disposal of the children. The children's personal work with the material aids their meditation on and absorption of the theme presented. The voice of the Good Shepherd can reach the child through different instruments, but regardless of the particular instrument, the voice of the Shepherd resounds in the depths of the heart.

18. The material must be attractive but "sober" and must strictly adhere to the theme being presented. The material must be simple, essential and "poor" in order to allow the richness of the themes content to shine through.

19. This same guideline (as in #18) applies to the atrium environment itself. The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd can be realized in any social or cultural setting.

20. The materials prepared by catechists for the atrium are faithful to the experimental models of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. The designs of these models are the result of a long, collaborative work of observation and experimentation and have been developed according to the needs of the child at each developmental stage.

SOLEMN MASS FOR ST. CECILIA

The 6 PM Mass on Wednesday, November 22nd for the Feast of St. Cecilia, patroness of musicians, will be a Solemn Mass with the Schola Cantorum singing Lou Harrison's *Mass for St. Cecilia's Day*. This is the centenary year of Harrison's birth and while a number of special musical offerings celebrating his music are taking place across the city, ours is the only opportunity to hear this beautiful chant-inspired Mass in its liturgical setting.

MUSIC NOTES

As you will read elsewhere in this bulletin, we are offering a series of classes on Sunday afternoons in November discussing the basics of the pipe organ. Organs were, until the industrial revolution, the most complex machine built by man. Throughout the early part of the 20th century, they were commonplace not just in churches and concert halls, but in theaters, movie palaces, auditoriums, mansions, and even department stores, playing not just hymns and Bach, but a wide range of orchestral transcriptions and popular tunes!

St. Vincent Ferrer has an 86-rank pipe organ built in two phases by the Schantz Organ Company of Orrville, Ohio; the 18-rank chancel organ (Opus 2145) was installed in 1998 and the 68-rank gallery organ (Opus 2224) in 2002. The instrument is played by a 4-manual console in the chancel. St. Catherine of Siena has a 3-manual, 58 rank Walker digital organ from 2015.

At every sung Mass (apart from during Lent when, according to Church regulations, use of the organ is restricted), organ voluntaries (prelude and postlude) are played. These are typically chosen so as to have a musical connection to the choral Music offered at the Solemn Mass. For example, on All Saints' Day, the organ music was by Percy Whitlock, an English contemporary of Lennox Berkeley and William Harris, the composers of the two motets. More information will follow in upcoming bulletins.

SOPHIE-VÉRONIQUE CAUCHEFER-CHOPLIN IN RECITAL

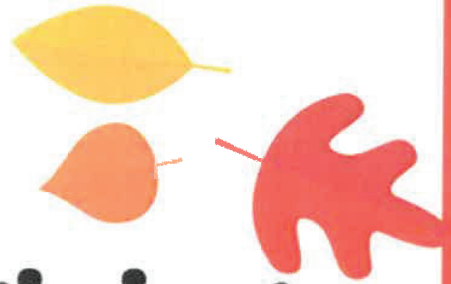
On Sunday, November 12 at 3 PM, famous French organist Sophie-Véronique Cauchefer-Choplin will offer an organ recital on the Schantz organ of St. Vincent Ferrer. Works of Vierne, Franck, Ibert, Pierné, and improvisations on submitted themes. A graduate of the Paris Conservatoire, Sophie-Véronique is the co-titular organist of the Parisian Church of St. Sulpice where Widor and Dupré served in the 20th century. She also was titular of the Church of St. Jean-Baptiste de la Salle in Paris from 1983 to 2013. She became the first woman to win the second prize in improvisation at the Chartres International Organ Improvisation Competition. Sophie-Véronique has an extensive international career, having given recitals worldwide in more than 30 countries. A free-will offering will be received.

For all of us baptized into the Body of Christ, that our unity with Christ our Head and with all the members of
